

GREETINGS FROM WOOSTER BRANCH AAUW PRESIDENT



As I sit here trying to write in this time of self-isolation and little social contact, an update on AAUW activities and sponsored events is a challenge. There is good news and bad news for the moment. The last newsletter included a number of events all occurring on April 18 that have now been impacted by the Covid-19 Coronavirus pandemic.

For example, after a lot of quick transitional planning to become a part of The College of Wooster Outreach, "Expanding Your Horizons 2020" has been canceled. I owe a debt of gratitude to Judy Kastelan for calling all districts for distribution numbers and to Anita Greene for rallying brochure delivery teams. The good news from this planning is that there is more lead time to assess processes for Expanding Your Horizons 2021, designing a new logo, and rethinking methods of information distribution.

The State AAUW Convention for 2020 has been rescheduled to September 12 at the Quest Polaris Conference Center in Columbus and will also include the Fall Summit. Keynote speakers will remain the same and the cost of this combined convention and summit should remain the same as the convention alone. AAUW Ohio will also be doing an electronic election of officers that will allow delegates to complete a ballot and vote from home. Specific details on voting will be received later.

Lastly, our Wooster Branch Spring Luncheon was also canceled due to the state recommendation for group gatherings not to exceed more than 50 people and their requirement that restaurants be closed. The good news is that we do have a slate of officers to nominate (see Carol McKiernan's article) and that, if need be, we can vote electronically.

Having no urgent items on the agenda, the March Board Meeting was also canceled. The good news for the May 28 agenda will be to welcome new officers, address the Kiwanis decision to continue the 2021 used book sale, and hear from our Scholarship Committee on proposed recipients for the coming year.

Ed McKiernan reports that book cleaning and processing is on a temporary hiatus. The good news is the number of books for the sale continues to grow.

All in all we have a lot to look forward to as spring is right around the corner with longer days, warmer weather, flowers, and lots of sunshine. Hopefully less social distancing as well!
