# GREETINGS FROM WOOSTER BRANCH AAUW PRESIDENT

After all the rapid fire cancellations mentioned in the last Newsletter, I am pleased to report that AAUW Wooster Branch has quickly adapted to new and successful ways of conducting business.

The nominating committee report by Chair Carol McKiernan was presented and approved by the Board via email with the slate of officers – Kris Evans and Susie Slack as Co-Presidents and Judy Taylor and Lee Peart as Program Co-Coordinators. In the absence of our annual meeting and thanks to Helen Atchison, this slate was voted on and approved by the membership via email on April 15.

Five members participated in the ZOOM state convention to elect new officers and hear reports from the various award committees. A combined state convention and fall summit is currently scheduled for September 12 in Columbus. A summary of the meeting and details on

state awards is available in the most recent AAUW-OH Orbit.

Carol McKiernan and Stefani Koorhan successfully conducted our first ZOOM Literary book selection. They are working on innovative ways to continue book reviews via ZOOM this summer.

The May 21 Board meeting with 12 attending was conducted via ZOOM May 28. A proposed newsletter publication schedule was set as follows: newsletters to be published January 20, March 15, June 15, August 15, and October 15. Additionally, Book Sale 2020 options, with respect to COVID-19 guidelines, were discussed. The Book Sale is still scheduled for September 30 - October 1 with Walt Kearney and Ed McKiernan working on ways to safely resume book processing. Final decisions regarding the Book Sale will be made in August.

Three scholarship recipients were approved. Details regarding the recipients appear in this newsletter. As of July, Karen Armstrong will replace Lee Peart as chair of the Scholarship Committee with the addition of new member Barb Friedhoff.

Cathy Frame Stone has resigned from leading the Cinema/Dinner interest group. If any member is interested in leading this group please let me or Kris Evans know. Mary Ann Merchant is currently planning to get AAUW Social Bridge and her bridge lessons under way.

Anita Greene reported that mail reminders will be sent to members who have not yet renewed their membership. The membership renewal form can be found on the Branch website.

#### SCHOLARSHIP AWARDS

This year the Scholarship Committee (Chair Lee Peart, Clara Ann Fain, and Karen Armstrong) received five applications and awarded three scholarships totaling \$4,000. One applicant applied from Wayne County, Michigan, and was referred to Community Foundations in her area. The fifth applicant mailed her application well past our May 1 deadline and it was received after the committee had made this year's awards. This applicant was notified that she missed the deadline and was encouraged to apply for next year.

The majority of this year's applicants were enrolled in "for-profit" colleges. Chair Lee Peart expressed concern to the Board about the high tuition cost of "for-profit" schools in comparison to "non-profit" schools and its potential economic effect on non-traditional women students. She recommended finding ways to encourage and direct women towards non-profit educational choices such as Ohio University's online programs. She also recommended finding ways to use social media to better reach potential applicants.

This year's recipients are:

Karen Wald, Bachelor of Nursing online from Ohio University. Anticipated completion 2021. This is her third award.

Morgan Stein, Associate of Nursing, RN, Bryant & Stratton College. Anticipated completion Summer 2021. This is her first award.

Lisa Elder, Bachelor of Business online from DeVry University. Anticipated completion January 2021. This is her second award.

July 1st Karen Armstrong will replace Lee Peart as Chair of the Scholarship Committee and Barb Friedhoff will be added to the committee as their new member.
